


alabaster and transience

Janet Manifold is a sculptor working primarily in alabaster. She completed an MA in Fine Art at Birmingham School of Art in 2019 and has recently exhibited work as part of the John Ruskin Biennial at the Museum of the Near Future, Lancaster University and the Hive, Birmingham.

Alabaster is a form of calcium and the concepts underpinning Janet's work have their origin in the influence of calcium on the rhythms and cycles of both the natural world and ourselves. The notion of 'time unfolding' extends from geological timescales at one extreme to the speed of a firing neuron at the other, and alabaster is a uniquely transient material through which to interpret these concepts.

Day trip to Oscott Chapel, Sutton Coldfield
and St Chad's Birmingham

We will leave from Ludlow Assembly Rooms at 9am. We have booked a luxury coach from M&J travel. On arrival at Oscott College we will have coffee.

The college is a Roman Catholic foundation training men for the RC Priesthood. It is not generally open to the public.

Oscott Chapel was built in just two years, 1836-1838, at a cost of £40,000 by Augustus Pugin. The college Chapel is considered to be one of Pugin's finest ecclesiastical designs in Gothic revival architecture.

Our guided tour will include the beautiful stained glass which has recently undergone extensive restoration similar to the work required to the windows at Saint Laurence's which is the subject of our fundraising efforts this year.

We will be able to enjoy the use of the historic refectory to consume our packed lunch. Before or after lunch there may be the opportunity to enjoy the college gardens.

After lunch we will drive the short distance to St Chad's Birmingham to visit the Roman Catholic cathedral which was also designed Pugin. It was consecrated on 21 June 1841. St Chad's is highlighted as one of Birmingham's most significant buildings in the recent Pevsner Architectural Guide to Birmingham. The Cathedral is especially proud of its unique collection of stained glass, metalwork and vestments made to Pugin's designs by John Hardman and Co. Saint Chads was the first new Cathedral built in England since the Reformation at a mere cost of £20,000, in 1839-41. The Lady Chapel is pure Pugin and much of the stained glass is by his son in-Law, John Hardman Powell, again we enjoy a guided tour.


